
### What is EDCTP?



- Public-Public Partnership between sovereign states in Europe and Africa
- EDCTP supports CLINICAL TRIALS and CAPACITY BUILDING in sub-Saharan Africa for poverty-related infectious diseases
- Strong focus on COLLABORATIVE research (minimum 3 different countries in most cases)

### Countries that can receive funding

- All sub-Saharan African countries
- All EU MSs and Associated Countries





### **How EDCTP works**



#### **General Assembly**

1 Member from each Participating State

**EDCTP Secretariat** 

The Hague + Cape Town

**Calls for Proposals** 



Capacity for Clinical Trials in Africa

Clinical Trials in Africa on PRDs

- Owned by the Participating States
- Minimum annual contribution of € 200,000 (cash and/or in-kind)
- Financial contribution from EU of € 683 M to the second programme (EDCTP2, 2014-24)
- Collaboration with other funders, industry etc: target of € 500 M
- Funding allocated to projects through open calls for proposals



## EDCTP in a nutshell (2003-2014)


