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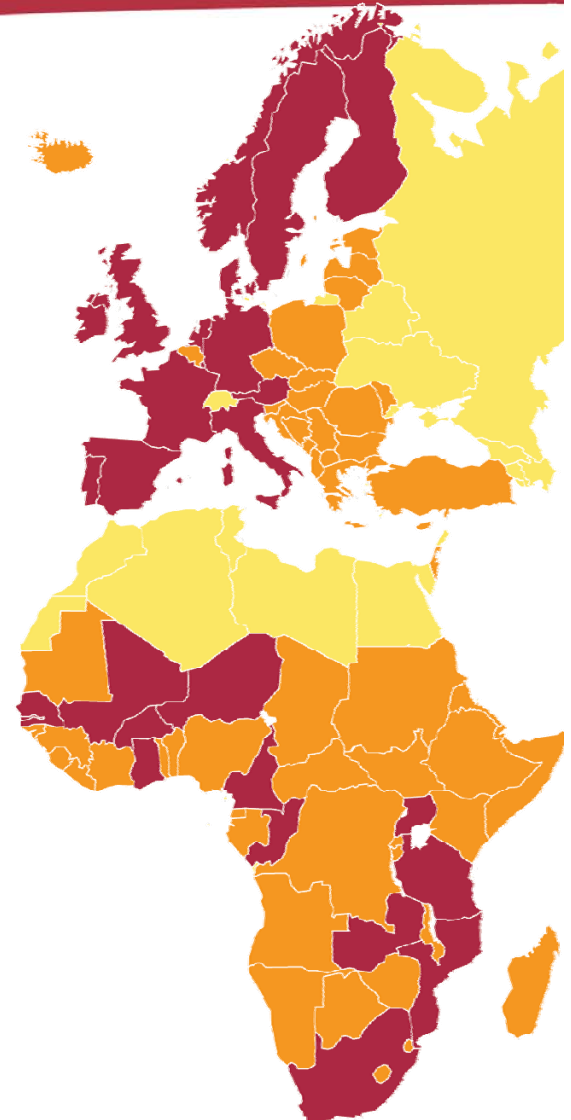
What is EDCTP?



- **Public-Public Partnership between sovereign states in Europe and Africa**
- **EDCTP supports CLINICAL TRIALS and CAPACITY BUILDING in sub-Saharan Africa for poverty-related infectious diseases**
- **Strong focus on COLLABORATIVE research (minimum 3 different countries in most cases)**

Countries that can receive funding

- All sub-Saharan African countries
- All EU MSs and Associated Countries

- Owned by the Participating States
- Minimum annual contribution of € 200,000 (cash and/or in-kind)
- Financial contribution from EU of € 683 M to the second programme (EDCTP2, 2014-24)
- Collaboration with other funders, industry etc: target of € 500 M
- Funding allocated to projects through open calls for proposals



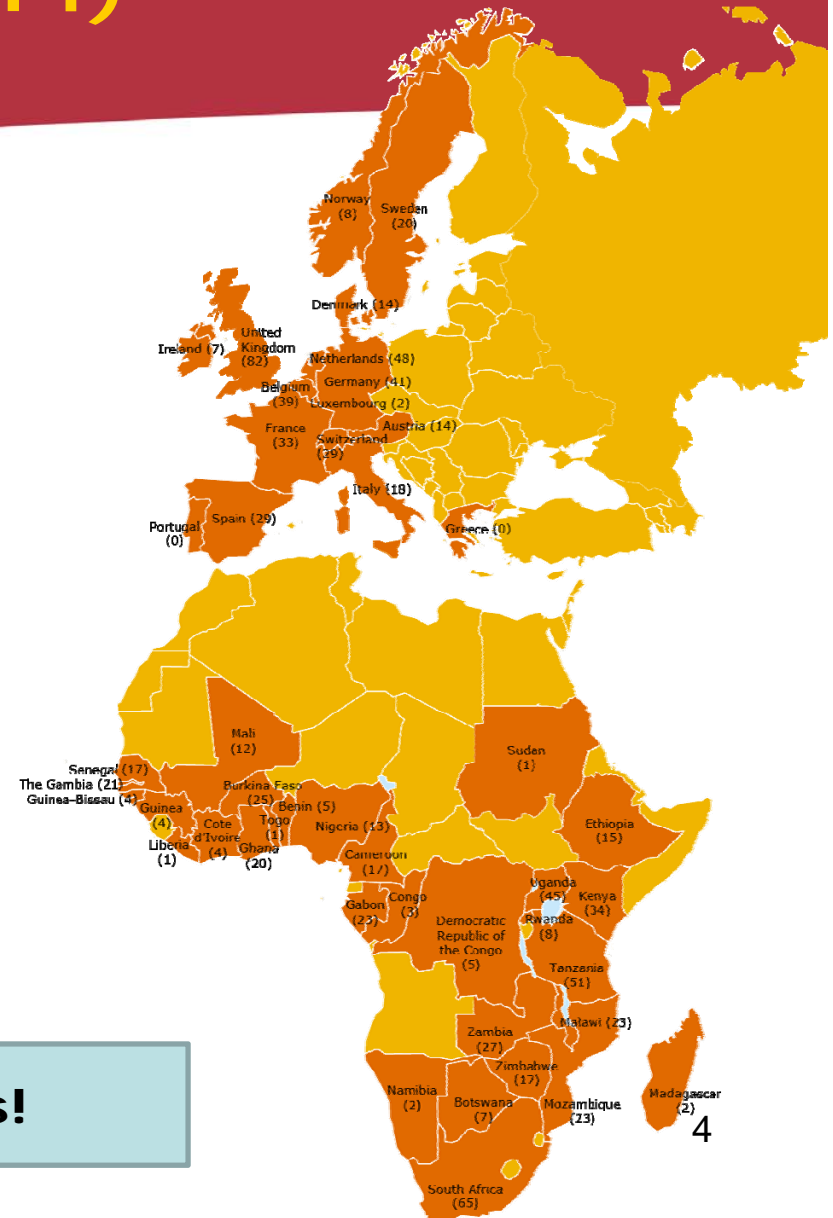
EDCTP in a nutshell (2003-2014)



Achievements:

- Number of grants awarded 254
- Participating countries
 - Sub-Saharan African* 30
 - European* 16
 - (involving 259 institutions + 3442 posts supported)
- African leadership 72%

- PhD/MSc trained >400
- Senior & Career Fellowships 56
- Clinical trials 100
- Publications (so far) >600

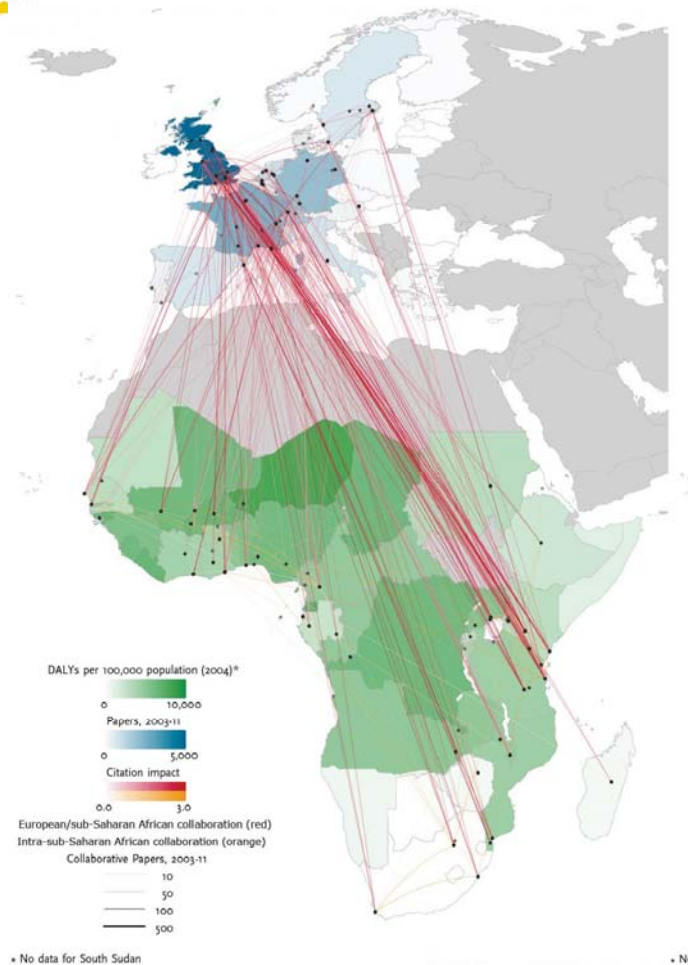

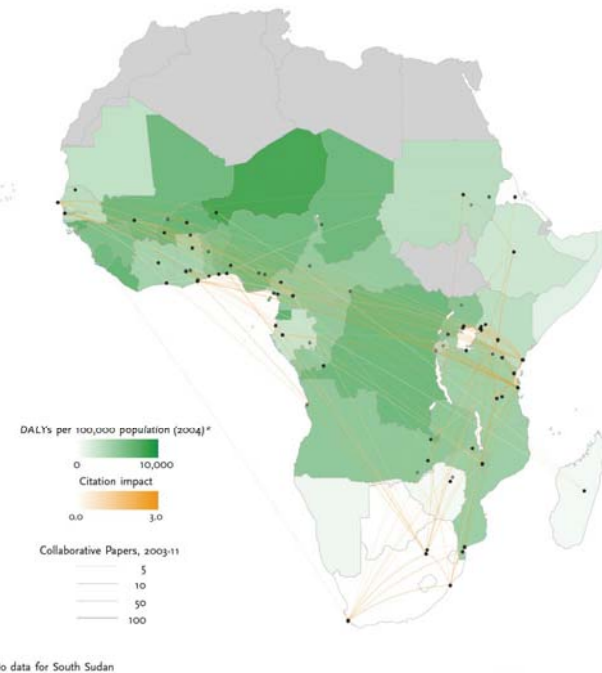
